V. Mark Durand

V. Mark Durand is known worldwide as an authority in the area of autism spectrum disorders. He is a professor of psychology at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg, where he was the founding Dean of Arts & Sciences and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. Dr. Durand is a fellow of the American Psychological Association and has received over \$4 million in federal funding to study the behavior problems in children with disabilities.

He received his B.A., M.A., and Ph.D.—all in psychology—at the State University of New York–Stony Brook.

Dr. Durand is currently a member of the Professional Advisory Board for the Autism Society of America. He is the co-editor of the Journal of Positive Behavior Interventions, has written 10 books and has over 100 publications on the topics of behavior therapy, functional communication, and educational programming. Dr. Durand also developed a unique treatment for severe behavior problems that is used worldwide.
