Included in the 12 hours may be no more than 6 hours of independent study (WMST 495) or field experience (WMST 491) credit.

All 21 hours may be courses with a WMST prefix, or a student’s program of study may include approved courses distributed across at least two other units in addition to those with a WMST prefix. These 6 hours may also be courses that students could take to fulfill the requirements of a second major, i.e., in history or English.
